Non-consensual Sexual Intercourse and Emotional Exploitation

JNU GSCASH report explicitly records in its report that the survivor is registering a complaint against Baruah for continuous emotional exploitation and one incident of non-consensual sexual intercourse. The charge here is thus of rape.

Prime Suspect in an FIR

The survivor filed an FIR after receiving threatening calls from male callers and attempts of email hacks. The police called Mitul Baruah twice for questioning and he was the prime suspect in this FIR. Mitul Baruah had to give a written statement. Post which, all the calls and hack attempts stopped.

Sexually Objectifying Students

In her deposition and mails, the survivor explicitly mentions that Mitul Baruah made comments on students such as that he is distracted by the dresses that girl students wear in Ashoka University. The Disciplinary Committee report also takes cognisance of this and says 'repeatedly stressed that she is not only seeking justice for herself but also seeking to ensure conditions conducive to the safety concerns of women students at the university.

Manipulative consent on the part of the defendant with the abuse of patriarchal power in the professional sphere centred around the workplace. Inappropriate and unprofessional behaviour given his position in the hierarchy. - JNU GSCASH

The allegations made in the complaint are of a fairly serious nature and could possibly involve a criminal offence. If found true, it would amount to serious misconduct. In light of the prima facie evidence that there has been gross misconduct on the part of the defendant. - CASH, Ashoka University

Dr. Baruah is guilty of misconduct according to all ethical norms of professional conduct and conduct at the workplace. - Disciplinary Committee, Ashoka University
